Keweenaw Bay Indian Community Substance Abuse Programs (KBICSAP) include both residential and outpatient treatment for alcoholism and chemical

dependency. KBICSAP is state licensed and CARF accredited and offers a variety of both traditional and Western treatment options that are culturally appropriate, holistic, and tailored to meet the needs of the individual. The program aims to lessen or eliminate the problems caused by substance abuse and to assist the individual in reestablishing a life characterized by balance and harmony through education and counseling.

Services Offered

Residential Treatment

New Day Treatment Center is a residential facility located in a country setting, one half mile from L'Anse Village. New Day has nearly 30 years of experience providing Substance Abuse Services for Native American adults living in the Bemidji Region (Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, and the northern part of Illinois), as well as non-Natives living in the 7 county WUPSCA region. New Day has an 18 bed capacity, offers therapy seven days a week, and length of stay is approximately 6 weeks. With a cultural consultant on staff, a sweat lodge on site, and transportation to and from local ceremonies and events, New Day provides its residents with numerous opportunities to heal through cultural and spiritual means.

Out-Patient Treatment

Keweenaw Bay Indian Community Substance Abuse Programs Outpatient Department offers service to all community adults and adolescents ages 9-17. Individual counseling is available on an outpatient basis. Length of Outpatient treatment is determined on an individual assessment for continuing sobriety.
