**Some general information about our program Services are:**

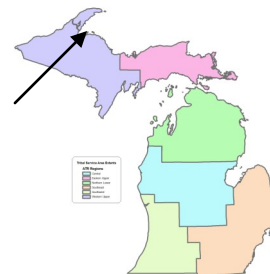
- ◆ State Licensed and CARF Accredited
