Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe



The Residential Treatment Center offers a community based program catering to the needs of Native Americans who want to begin a journey to recovery. Programming is based on the Twelve Steps and incorporates the cultural and traditional teachings as part of the healing process. Residents are exposed to the Ojibwe language, ceremonies, native values and historical contexts through our cultural curriculum which is supported by our clinical approaches.



Service Population / Admission Criteria:

- ◆ Adult (18+)
- ◆ Saginaw Chippewa Tribal Member or
- ◆ Members of Federally Recognized Tribes of 5 service areas: Claire, Isabella, Missaukee, Midland and Arenac.
- ◆ Direct Descendents of Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe
- ◆ Free from substances for 72 hours
- ◆ Free of or under complete control of any infectious disease such as TB, Hepatitis C, and HIV
- ◆ Must have the ability to pay for services (Currently Chippewa Tribe has Grant Funds which may help with costs.)
