TRANSITIONAL SUPPORTIVE LIVING PROGRAM



Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe



The Residential Treatment Center’s Supportive Living Program (SLP) is designed to support Native American adults in early recovery to achieve and maintain sobriety through a structured and supportive environment providing outpatient case management, life skills, education, and mental health and substance abuse counseling services in a live environment. The SLP allows for a step down process from the residential service environment and brings the responsibility for sustained recovery back to the client. The client participating in this program is expected to engage in community education and employment opportunities while acclimating back into the community as a sober individual.



Service Population / Admission Criteria:

- ◆ Adult Male & Female
- ◆ Members of Federally Recognized Tribes of 5 service areas: Claire, Isabella, Missaukee, Midland and Arenac.
- ◆ Direct Descendents of Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe.
- ◆ Eligible for services and registered at Nimkee Memorial Wellness
- ◆ Diagnosed with a substance abuse or dependence
- ◆ Recent completion of a residential treatment program
- ◆ Medical examination completed within 24 hours prior to admission, unless transitioning directly from the Saginaw Chippewa Behavioral Health Residential Treatment Program
- ◆ Have the ability to pay for services and housing costs
- ◆ Assessment which supports the need for the level of care and a motivation to maintain sobriety and engage in services

Length of Stay:

- ◆ Varies for each person
